

### **Capitol Jeopardy Directions – For Teachers**

After your class has taken the tour of the Capitol, play Capitol Jeopardy to see what all the class has learned.

Divide your class into three teams.

Project the “Jeopardy! Capitol Edition” PowerPoint. (For teachers, you can either print out the answer key PowerPoint or have it on your laptop where the students cannot see it).

Randomly choose a team to go first. They will pick a category by number of points. For example, “History for 5 points,” will mean they will answer the first question in the History category. If the team that chose the question gets it right, they will earn five points. If they get it wrong, the other two teams have the chance to answer in 60 seconds. Whichever team calls out the correct answer first (of the two remaining teams), earns 5 points and gets to choose the next category. If none of the teams can answer, the teacher may reveal the answer and then randomly select another team to choose another category or the same category but a different question.

There are five categories and six questions per category. Each category totals to 105 points. The entire board is worth 525 points.
